#### President's Message–SFC

Guy Magallenes, with his bubbly personality, showed an attentive crowd his method of applying clear glazes in preparing a water color painting of bright and intense color and depth, at his November 21 demonstration at SWA gallery. He employed liquid mask-out (frisket) to leave white paper areas in washes for later details. He had prepared eight or ten carefully drawn versions of a painting in pencil to illustrate his layering of washes to achieve the intensity he was after. I marveled at his patience in redrawing the same details so many times. After one time I would be ready to move on to the next project.

Which leads me to think of the discussion we often have: Art vs. Craft, or Artist vs. Craftsperson. What is the difference? And does it really matter? Well, we have to look into what we mean by "artist" and "craftsperson." Artist: flair, originality, temperament, talent, breaking the rules, etc. Craftsman: master of tools and skills, calm, worker, pride in his work, knows the rules of his craft, etc.

There is currently a resurgence of interest in crafts, that they give satisfaction to the individual and a sense of control over something in their lives and of creativity. Most of our efforts are spent on the craft of drawing and painting. And yet we hope and aspire to produce a piece that touches viewers with something more—some feeling that goes beyond craftsmanship. The crafts have their rules and can be taught. Art goes beyond the fundamental skills can perhaps only be pointed to. Think about it. What's your thought?

Don't miss the next demonstration. It will give you something to think about.
